## *Human Security Committee 2021*

The 2021 Human Security Student Committee aims to create a vibrant social and academic environment, as well as raise awareness about the Human Security programme outside the institute. Through academic and social events we seek to develop ideas that connect our cohort and alumni with organisations that can provide insights about future career paths and networks of professionals. By way of inter-disciplinary events and intra-committee coordination, we aim to inaugurate new Human Security traditions that bring cohorts and alumni together to secure the legacy of Human Security today, tomorrow and forever. In line with the sociocratic model, the committee is organized with a big amount of interaction between the different subcommittees.

### **Coordination Committee**

The coordination group functions as a central point for all groups. We are responsible for intra-committee communication, scheduling, committee budget, and funding applications. Members of this group will also keep an overview of ongoing projects.

### **Academic Committee**

The Academic group would like to focus our work around cross-disciplinary *collaboration and partnerships*, both locally and globally, to increase the program's impact and create a professional network. Events can include film screenings, guest lectures, peer lectures (e.g. inviting previous Human Security students, students who operate within the same field, and those who have experience with fieldwork etc.), career events and networking events. Furthermore, events can be both in-person or virtual. The subcommittee will plan events that address current and relevant themes to our studies. We aim to create opportunities that allow us to apply our theoretical knowledge from classes in a real-world context both for the Human Security programme participants and the surrounding programmes on Moesgaard Campus. By being involved and collaborating with external stakeholders, our goal is to foster involvement, learn, and co-create.

### **Outreach Committee**

The outreach group is responsible for promoting the Human Security programme and managing the programme's social media platforms. In addition, the outreach group plans and facilitates ways to promote the Human Security programme. The aim is to increase awareness of the programme outside of Aarhus University both in Denmark and on an international level, and to attract potential new students and employers. Furthermore, a social media assistant will be appointed who is responsible for maintaining active sharing of the programme's activities online. This includes posting on the Human Security official Facebook page, LinkedIn, and website with posts that feature Human Security Profiles of former and current Human Security students to show the diversity of the programme.

### **Social Committee**

Social events are organised to create a social network outside of the academic environment and to strengthen the group atmosphere among students. These include internal events, such as film screenings, cultural and sports activities as well as theme parties. Furthermore, social events will

encompass different activities aiming to promote the importance of sustainability. For instance, volunteering at beach clean-ups, planting trees, picking mushrooms, or sustainable cooking classes.

### **UN Delegates**

The two members from the UN Council (Uddannelsesnævn) channel information between the students in the Human Security programme and the UN. This is to ensure the academic basis for the programme as well as shaping the overall educational environment both at Moesgaard Campus and at Aarhus University in general. The UN delegates will meet once per month and represent the Human Security programme during these conversations.
