Manifesto

The Human Security Committee is a student-led programme committee responsible for academic events, social events and programme outreach. The committee meets monthly with the programme coordinator to discuss events and future developments.

Academic Committee

The academic committee would like to focus on cross-disciplinary collaboration and partnerships at a local and global level to increase the program's impact and create a professional network while also including diverse perspectives. Events can include workshops, film screenings, guest lectures, peer lectures, panel debates (e.g. inviting previous Human Security students, students who operate within the same field, and those who have experience with fieldwork, etc.), career events and networking events. Furthermore, events can be both in-person and/or virtual. The subcommittee will plan events that address current and relevant themes to our studies. We aim to create opportunities that allow us to apply our theoretical knowledge from classes in a real-world context both for the Human Security programme participants and the surrounding programmes at Aarhus University. Our goal is to foster involvement, motivational learning, and co-creation by being involved and collaborating with external stakeholders.

New approaches to the community mindset are currently in the making, including The Broken Window Theory, and outreach to potential external stakeholders has already begun.

All events should be documented so that the following cohorts may have a basis for future projects.

Social Committee

The social committee aims to create a balance between academic and social life at the university and to provide students with the opportunity to interact with each other and build relationships outside of the classroom. We will organize a variety of events throughout the year, including but not limited to: movie nights, bonfires, winter bathing, and sports activities. We want everyone to feel at home in Aarhus and at Moesgaard Campus. In addition, we want to build a happy and intercultural connected social environment.

Outreach Committee

The outreach committee aims to inform future students of the Human Security master's program. We would like to offer practical information through interviews with and blog posts by current and former students. Through thematic blog posts by students (e.g. excerpts of their research), we want to further increase the visibility of students' expertise and heighten the academic value of the Human Security program website for outsiders. Utilizing social media such as Instagram, X, the program's homepage, and Facebook we aim to spread the word about human security. We are willing to collaborate with the official social media account of AU or other programs to address the inner workings of our master's program. We also want to organize events to promote the Human Security program and to show companies that are relevant to our field of study what we are learning. We hope this promotion will be useful for future job opportunities. To enable everyone who is interested in the program to study at Aarhus University our ideal plan is to establish the Human Security fund for students who can not access our program due to financial issues.

UN Committee

The UN delegates from the UN Council (Uddannelsesnævn) aim to channel information between the students in the Human Security programme and the UN. The members will represent the Human Security programme at monthly meetings with other representatives from the University. Students from the Human Security program with relevant feedback or concerns can inform any UN members, who will forward these to the rest of the Council at the meetings. The goal is to ensure the academic basis for the programme and the overall educational environment, both at Moesgaard Campus and at Aarhus University in general. The members will have one open meeting during the semester for all Human Security students, where relevant information from the Council meeting will be presented. Other issues can also be raised and discussed at this at this time. The aim of this meeting is to engage other students and create a space for the cohort where issues can be discussed internally if needed.
